These wonderful verses guide us to the Lord in whom we are to trust, not ourselves or our plans, and certainly not the world's wisdom and devices. At Mission Without Borders, in 2021, we responded to the increasing poverty and isolation in the communities we work in Eastern Europe caused by the pandemic. More Operation Christmas Love boxes were distributed to struggling families than ever before. We also made 84 truck deliveries of essential items from roofing and housing materials, mattresses, canned food and hygiene products through to face masks and hand sanitiser.

We know that our impact is more fruitful and longer lasting through the partnerships we have with the local church and organisations rooted in the community. Working with some 313 churches, these partnerships are a powerful way of responding to local need and demonstrating the love of Jesus.

After a long period marked by isolation and restrictions, last year nearly 5,000 children enjoyed a great time of fun and fellowship at Mission Summer Camps. The happiness of reuniting with each other, with the MWB staff and volunteers was overwhelming and the perfect "therapy" after such a stressful period.

None of this work could happen without the extraordinary help given by you – our faithful Mission Without Borders supporters. We have been humbled by the kindness and generosity of friends, charitable trusts, churches, sponsors and donors who have stood with the Mission as it seeks to transform the lives of those living in desperate poverty.

Finally, please do pray for the troubling situation in the Ukraine. People have suffered and lost so much already so please pray that God's light would shine into the darkness and that peace would prevail. Mission Without Borders is continuing to support refugee families and elderly people in eastern Ukraine who have been most affected by the conflict.

Thank you again for all you have done and continue to do for Mission. With every blessing

There is so much to share with you as our ministry did not stall in 2021. We started work in two new communities enrolling 38 families, the first in Shkodra in north-west Albania and the second in Kamza, near the capital, Tirana. Thanks to your help we started work in a new community in Jajce, providing firewood and warm clothes to new families. 44,305 soup kitchen meals were served, providing nutritious food to the elderly and enabling people to stay strong in the winter months when job opportunities are few.



We thank God that this year we opened a new centre in Ognyanovo in southwestern Bulgaria supporting 65 families. Over 35,000 meals were served at our street homeless project in Sofia while regular Mission summer camps were held again for children, enabling them to have fun and spend time listening to and studying God's Word.



It has been a tough year for 25-year-old nurse Ketjona Vzharri who works in a hospital in Durres, Albania's second city. While proud of the work she and her colleagues have undertaken on the COVID-19 frontline, Ketjona does not regard herself as a heroine. And without the support of generous sponsors, she may never have been able to train and qualify as a nurse, graduating from the University of Tirana with a Masters qualification.

"I attribute my success to Mission Without Borders and the wonderful people who supported my family and my studies", **Ketjona says**. "My family is now able to support themselves financially, and I will be forever grateful to them and to our Lord."

"The help I received, financial, spiritual and emotional, was such a blessing for me and my family, enabling me to study at one of the best universities in Albania" Looking back, Ketjona and her family could never have dreamt of such an opportunity and she recalls her family's gratitude to MWB, "I never imagined that one day my dreams would come true!" she says. "I really feel very blessed by the opportunity I've been given and will always try to give my best as a nurse."

Ketjona has also learnt a great deal about caring for others from the example set by her MWB sponsors, whose actions have inspired her in the values to live by. "I am full of joy, knowing that in life you can achieve everything by faith and by loving and taking care of each other" she says.

The Mission Without Borders scholarship programme supports young people who want to continue their education to a higher level after finishing school but can't afford to pay for their studies. Educational costs are more than just tuition fees; many of the communities we work with are rural, and the nearest college or university can be hundreds of kilometres away.



"Scholarships are a great way to help a young person like Ilie Iosif get started on a career. Unlocking potential in an individual who has faced such a difficult start in their childhood can make such a difference."

Helen Moulds, a MWB supporter is, like Ketjona, a trained nurse. Now retired, Helen recently sponsored Ilie Iosif Potop from Romania, helping with the cost of tuition fees, travel and accommodation expenses so he could study electrical engineering at university.



To study, many students must board during term time. Through the help of sponsors, the Mission provides young people from poor families with the financial support that enables them to study at university or vocational college and pursue careers such as nursing, teaching and medicine. Last year, 683 University and Vocational College students received financial assistance to enable them to persevere in their studies.

"I've visited both the
Ukraine and Moldova
with the Mission and have seen the wonderful work

We need each other. This is why last year Mission Without Borders worked in partnership with around 313 churches in Eastern Europe. Nurturing these relationships, both on the mission field and with churches in the UK, is vital to our vision of reaching people for Christ.

One of our partner churches is Christ Church, Cheltenham. I recently spent some time with their new Vicar Simon Heron and with Philip and Amanda



Whitefield who are leaders in the missional work of the church. They talked about the criteria used when deciding whom to partner with. Amanda commented, "We look for missionary organisations that demonstrate the love of Christ as shown in Matt 25:31-46

and MWB ticks these boxes". I thoroughly enjoyed my time with the folk of Christ Church Cheltenham and

was deeply encouraged by their passion for the local church and zeal to extend the Kingdom of God.

The longer I walk with Jesus, the more I see that partnership in the work of the Lord is



not only a necessity but also, a great joy. Working with churches here in the UK is a great privilege. In 2022 MWB is looking to build friendships and working relationships with more church leaders, workers and congregations and provide support through prayer and resources.

Operation Christmas Love boxes full of essential food and Christian literature were a lifeline to struggling families at Christmas

We received terrific support from Premier Christian Radio who interviewed MWB Ukraine Programme Manager Volodymyr Brychuk as well as receiving coverage on Pam Rhodes's programme. Together with the Stewardship organisation, who also supported this Christmas Appeal, as well as you – our wonderful supporters - more than £89,000 was raised in response to our OCL appeal, enough to supply around 3,500 parcels. Thank you so much.

Many also sent lovely messages of encouragement that we placed in or on our OCL boxes to beneficiaries. These brought such comfort and hope to children and families who read them.

With the support MWB received from around the world, we were able to deliver 42,000 Operation Christmas Love (OCL) boxes – more than we have ever done before – to vulnerable families and individuals in Eastern Europe.

In the Ukraine, staff and volunteers worked through cold and frosty days, to pack boxes ready for distribution. One volunteer, Oleksandr, who comes from a poor rural family, explained his desire to help, "The Mission gave me a great opportunity to study for free to help in my dream to become a chef. I'm glad that today I can give, at least my time and energy, for the sake of others."

2,650 OCL parcels were distributed by 20 churches to refugee families and the elderly who have been suffering the devastating effects of the ongoing conflict in the Donetsk and Luhansk regions of Eastern Ukraine.

One refugee, Olha, now lives alone with cerebral palsy, in Blahodatne, western Ukraine, after her mother's death from cancer.



"My mother died soon after we moved," Olha said. "I wish she was with me, but I find many little reasons to be joyful every day. I am limited physically, but my heart and my soul are free. I'm happy that I found a new family in Christ. I thank MWB for the Operation Christmas Love parcels. I cannot thank the people who gave generously in person, but I will keep them in my prayers."

Alexandru counted the days down until camp. When the day finally came, he was in heaven: "Here we have the best food and accommodation, the best activities, games, Christian lessons & songs and the best leaders ever! We play a lot in teams and I like it! This way, we get to know each other better and also make new friends. I never want to leave this place! Thank youuuuuu!"

As they grow older children will not forget the way we made them feel and the fellowship they experienced. Thank you again for your generosity and love which reached straight into the children's hearts!



THE KINDNESS OF STRANGERS CHANGES A CHILD'S LIFE



Today MWB friends from around the world sponsor around 12,000 children and families. It is one of the best ways to provide direct help to children and families in need and gives them real hope for a brighter future. Developing a close relationship with a family and sharing in the stories of their everyday lives can make for an unforgettable experience.



One such person who is helping in this way is Matthieu, who took out a MWB child sponsorship last year.

"Education has always been an issue close to my heart. I was lucky enough to have good parents who did their best to give me a good education and send me to an excellent school. At an early age, I understood that not all children were

as privileged as me, and by the time I finished school, I wanted to become an educator in an orphanage. Divine providence decided otherwise, but I have always wanted to help other children. That is why I took out a sponsorship with MWB: I can support the physical and spiritual wellbeing of a child and share with him the benefits of a good education."

Sponsorship helps provide practical support including lifesaving essential food, housing and insulation materials to



keep warm in winter, as well as school equipment, books and after school classes to help children complete their education. They also have the chance to hear the gospel.

Amongst those we currently support are 490 children in Cantemir, one of the poorest communities in Moldova. One young person there is Gabriela. Her home has no toilet or running water and her stepfather sometimes drinks non-stop for days and is abusive.



Pastor Boris, who works with the Mission, takes up the story; "Gabriela was traumatised by her awful situation at home. She often stole food from the market or from people's yards. At a counselling session, she said to me, 'I don't want to steal, but when I haven't eaten for a day or two, I'm so hungry I do it."

"Since Gabriela started attending the youth club regularly, she has become calmer, more peaceful and changed her speech and behaviour," Boris said. "Gabriela also doesn't steal anymore. Now when she comes to the club she says, "I feel so good when I'm here, it's like I'm in heaven. I wouldn't ever want to leave."

The Nastas family is just one of those families. Stela Nastas is raising her children alone after losing her husband to a heart attack six years ago. The family live in just two rooms in an old house in northern Moldova. "After my husband died, lonelines, hopelessness and insecurity were my closest friends- but I realised I had to stay strong for my children", she says.

Everything changed for Stela and her children when they were enrolled on the MWB family sponsorship programme. "The Mission offered warmth not only to our house and

bodies but also to our souls! I can't imagine what our lives would look like now if we hadn't met the Mission some years ago."

Legacy gifts from supporters can make all the difference, ensuring that their lifetime of love, faith and generosity lives on. Brenda and Gerald have supported MWB from the early days. "My daughter went to Albania and she loved the people, but she saw how much needs to be done," Brenda told us. "MWB is not a well-known organisation, but it is one of my favourite charities. As I was left some money, I wanted to use it to bring help and hope to others less fortunate."
